Thank you both for putting this together. Your knowledge of performance venues are far superior to mine, but I can certainly emphasize points which I think are important considerations for the venue in Neahwa Park.

- 1. FYI: Oneonta's Mobile Stage has been reserved for City events (19)-times and reserved by other organizations (16)-times from April-September of this year
- 2. Location, Location, Location-most important!
 - a. Top priority is to identify WHERE this venue will be placed in Neahwa
 - b. The <u>Parks Master Plan (2013)</u> placed a New Performance Stage at the current bandstand stage area
 - c. Projected cost at that time was \$150,000.00
 - d. I do not have size projections from that report, but we're looking...will let you know
 - e. At our meeting we talked about Field #5 as another potential space
- 3. I agree a WOOD structure is preferred to a Clam-Style structure
 - a. You've already identified cost as a the number one reason
 - b. Almost as important to me is that a wood structure will preserve the authentic, intimate-feel of performances in the Park
 - c. Wood can be well-built and resourced locally
 - d. I think an electrical, equipment (wood) storage building built at or near the new venueshould be considered as part of this project
- 4. For the Park...I think a permanent structure with *limited/controlled access* should be a preference
 - a. Security should be a priority
- 5. Audience seating, viewing is an important consideration
 - a. Our current concerts, movies, shows require spectators to bring their own chairs or blankets and/or to remain in their vehicles
- 6. Public Support/Marketing
 - a. I'd like to see the capability (technology) to project Park art, photos and upcoming events at this facility, when not in use
- 7. A crazy thought would be for us to consider a dance area, platform
 - a. In front of or near the stage
 - b. either permanent (concrete) or moveable (wood)....?
 - c. I will defer to others on the task force on this
